

Greetings from Boston Pride,

This year's Boston Pride week theme, "Celebrating 30 Years of Worldwide Pride Movement," pays tribute to the founding of InterPride, the International Association of Pride organizers, in Boston in 1982. 

Human Rights in Pride – for Pride Week and Beyond

ride Week is finally almost upon us and 2012 is already promising to be an important year for an emerging consensus around rights for our community. President Barack Obama's recent statement affirming his support for marriage equality - the first sitting president to do so - is an important step in achieving the goal that so many of us have looked for equal rights and protections under the law in a whole host of matters, especially related to families.

But the truth is that we know we still have a long, long way to go to achieve the kind of equality, regardless of identity and orientation, which we are seeking. As a

strongly believe that providing education and information is an important part of what we do. In the past year, we have embarked on a human rights listening tour around the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and we've learned a lot from members of the community from Northampton to the South Shore to Boston about what social issues continue to concern you.

During Pride Week, the

Boston Pride Human Rights and Education committee will host a forum on the question of teaching LGBT history in Massachusetts schools. Last year, the state of California passed legislation that seeks to add to the California public school social science curriculum information on the contributions and roles of various groups (including LGBT individuals) in California and throughout the country. Our event will include representatives from The Boston Alliance of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender

Youth (BAGLY), MassEquality, Fenway Health, and others discussing the question of adding such a provision to Massachusetts's educational curriculum. We invite you to join us at this forum at the Fenway Health Auditorium on the evening of Tuesday, June 5th from 7 – 9 p.m.

Once the Pride Parade

floats are broken down and the Festival and block party performers are heading home, there is still much to be done to keep the Pride movement vibrant and pertinent to the times, which is part of the reason why we are so excited to be hosting the education forum during Pride Week. As soon as Pride Week concludes, we will be turning our attention to the annual InterPride conference, which we are sponsoring this


Boston Pride has been selected as the host of the 2012 Annual World Conference of

A: What hasn't evolved? This





tion of their work supporting the Transgender Equal Rights Bill, which was signed into law by Governor Deval Patrick in January. The law made Massachusetts the 16th state to add non-discrimination laws for gender identity in employment, housing, K-12 public education, and credit. Additionally, Massachusetts hate crimes laws were also updated to include gender identity. More information on MTPC can be found at their Web site (www.masstpc.org).

The community also voted to name Brendan Burke as an Honorary Marshal, which is given posthumously. Burke, who was an athlete and student manager of the Red-Hawks ice hockey team at Miami University (Ohio),





Determined Bateman: Lesbian cancer survivor turned music star

Idgy and emotional singer/songwriter Lauren Bateman will be Irocking Boston Pride this year. Quitting her job as a scientist to become a star, there is no stopping this dedicated and determined musician. Since playing her first show in Boston in 2006 armed with only her guitar and PA, her sound has now evolved into a full-band experience that is sure to delight and captivate.

Q: What can fans expect from your new album?

A: This album digs a little more into my rock roots. I am highly influenced by artists like Pat Benatar, Melissa Etheridge, Stevie Nicks and Brandi Carlile, so that energy comes out in this album. I did not have a band for my first album, so this new release sounds very cohesive and tight. I have gotten a lot of

great feedback from listeners saying that they love the mood and rocking feel of the album. I am happy that people are really digging it.

Q: How did you decide to

pursue a career in music,

after previously being employed as a research scientist? What was that transition like for you? A: I originally worked for a pharmaceutical company in cancer research. I am a cancer survivor myself, so I thought it was a good calling for me. I really enjoyed the work; it's just music spoke to me more. I went on a cruise that hosted many musicians like the Indigo Girls, Patti Griffin, Shawn Mullins and other great artists. It was an amazing experience. I even got to perform for my idol, Brandi Carlile, which was probably the most nervous I have ever been performing. I was so moved by this experience that when I got home, I knew



I had to do music for the rest of my life. I could seriously do music 12-16 hours a day and never get bored. It never feels like work to me and that's how you know you made the right decision. It was not a hard transition to make. It was deciding that that's the direction I was going to take with my life that was tough. I was going to move from a great job with amazing benefits to being a full-time musician. Some people tried to convince me otherwise, but it was the best decision I have made in my life, other than picking up a


Q: Besides playing at Boston Pride, what else do you have planned for this year?



Justin Waithe grew up directing music in church, attended Berklee College of Music, and has sung the National Anthem for the beloved Boston Celtics on many occasions. Sheree Dunwell grew up singing classical music as well as opera. The EP is being sold at Newbury Comics' 29 retail stores throughout New England.


thick of excitement when we're together and we're like little kids so open to magic that it shows up every time. I put a lot of joy into this album and I hope it comes through when people listen to it.


Q: You have been compared to Bjork and Annie Lennox.

How do you feel about that?


